TUITION AND FEE
SCHEDULES FOR

CREDIT CLASSES

Tuition and fees shall be charged in accordance with state statutes and regulations and according to schedules established by the Board. The Board of Regents of Galveston College reserves the right to change, without notice, tuition, required fees, other charges, and related requirements and regulations as necessitated by College District or legislative action(s).

SENIOR CITIZEN
STUDENTS

All U.S. citizens who are residents of Galveston Community College District who have attained the age of 65 years are entitled to enroll for classes at a reduced rate, except those listed hereafter (when applicable): individual music instruction, liability insurance, health fees, and testing fees.

PUBLICATION OF
TUITION AND FEES

The tuition and fee charges for semester hour credit classes shall be set forth in an itemized schedule and made available to the general public prior to each registration period. Approved Tuition and Fee Schedules shall be published in the College Catalog, class schedules, and/or on the college website (www.gc.edu).

PAYMENT OF TUITION
AND FEES

Tuition and fees are due and payable in full at the time of registration unless prior arrangements have been made through one of the available installment plans (*Education Code 54.007 (a), (b), and (d) as published in the catalog, class schedule, or on the college website.*

TUITION REFUNDS

Students who officially withdraw shall have tuition and appropriate fees refunded as prescribed by Coordinating Board policy, state law, or College policy, as appropriate. Refund schedules shall be published in the College Catalog, class schedules, and/or the college website.

TUITION AND FEES
FOR CONTINUING
EDUCATION CLASSES

The Vice President of Instruction shall recommend the tuition and fees for all continuing education classes and all CEU credit with final approval of tuition and fees resting with the President.

Continuing Education tuition and fees are variable and depend upon:

1. Length of courses (in contact hours).

2. Number of meeting sessions.
3. Need for related study aids beyond normal text of reference.
4. Special services and materials in addition to instruction (i.e., uniforms, transportation, basic skills training, catering, pens, pencils, paper, etc.)
5. Travel associated with training.
6. Course development costs.
7. Instructional equipment rental or purchase.
8. Instructional salaries.
9. Course marketing costs.

Based on the \$25 minimum tuition stated in Section 54.04 of the Texas Education Code, a minimum of \$.50 per contact hour for continuing education courses that generate state formula funding shall be assessed, with one exception. The exception is that zero tuition may be charged for continuing education courses when a minimum of 20 percent of the College's costs for facilities, instructor salary, equipment, and/or other expenses is covered by business, industry, or other local public or private clients. The College reserves the right to change, without notice, tuition, fees, other charges, and related requirements and regulations as necessitated by the College or by legislative action.
