



NURA 1001.1969 | 60 Hours | 1/30-4/12 | T, R | 5:30pm-8:30pm | R-259 | Instructor: O'Neal NURA 2005.4810 | 40 Hours | Clinical (Student must enroll in both courses)

Become a Certified Nurse Aide (CNA) in a long-term care facility. Explore the key components set by Texas Department of Aging and Disability Services. Course topics may include residents' rights, communication, safety observation, reporting, and basic comfort and care. Emphasis is placed upon effective interaction with the health care teams. CPR Training is provided as part of the course but may be outside of stated class time. Students must enroll concurrently in both NURA 1001 (classroom 60 hrs) and NURA 2005 (clinical 40 hrs) to complete the program and be eligible for examination. Clinical hours are scheduled at various times by the instructor, and may include day, evening, and/or weekend times. Please visit our website or page 4. to see the healthcare program requirements that must be met prior to clinical. Students must wear burgundy scrubs and white shoes to clinical. The student is responsible for transportation to and from the clinical sites. Textbook is included with tuition. Scrubs are available for purchase along with stethoscope and watch with a second hand in the bookstore. Students are responsible for scheduling certification testing and paying testing fees online, this is separate from tuition. This program is eligible for a payment plan.

#### Certified EKG Technician (CET) (10 Weeks) \$899

ECRD 1011.1967 | 64 Hours | 1/29-4/11 | M, W | 5:30pm-9:30pm | N-253 | Instructor: Ware

Study the heart's anatomy, function, how it produces electricity, and how one records this electricity with the EKG and telemetry monitor. Course also covers the EKG changes of commonly seen diseases, especially coronary artery disease and the important heart rhythm disturbances. This course prepares students to take the NHA certification exam to be EKG and/or telemetry monitor technicians and introduces them to skills necessary for employment in exercise laboratories. Textbook and study guide are included in the tuition. Students must have a valid BLS-CPR card prior to enrolling in the course. The course includes one attempt at the certification exam. This exam will be scheduled by the instructor and is non-refundable and non-transferable. This program is eligible for a payment plan.

#### Health Unit Coordinator (16 Weeks) \$899

Learn to perform the tasks and responsibilities of a health unit coordinator in support of medical staff, nursing personnel, hospital departments, as well as to assist patients and visitors. The program includes interactive lectures, labs and exercises designed to review medical terminology, methods of effective communication and progressive management techniques. Students will perform multiple exercises in the complexities of transcribing physician's orders, patient chart documentation, HIPAA regulations, dietary orders, vital signs documentation, and ordering of diagnostic and therapeutic testing.

(Textbooks and study guide must be purchased separately)



Our relationship with the National Healthcare Association, allows us to offer a series of credentials that stack into a Patient Care Tech Certification. Students who complete our Nurse Aide, Phlebotomy and EKG program are eligible to enroll in our Patient Care Tech Certification Course. This course is offered on an individual basis, or in the late spring/summer terms.



#### **HEALTHCARE PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS:**

The State of Texas requires that all students in direct patient contact have obtained the immunizations below. In addition, we must abide by any requirements put forth by our clinical facilities. It is the student's responsibility to obtain all immunizations in the proper time frame; students will not be allowed to enroll or begin clinicals unless all requirements are satisfied.

Hep B: a series of 3 immunizations and documentation of a positive titer 4-6 weeks after the 3rd immunization (it takes a minimum of 4 months to complete the series of three immunizations). If you need to fast track you can request a TWINRIX combo vaccine. Influenza (flu): proof of one dose within the last year.

Measles, Mumps & Rubella (MMR): If you were born in or after 1957 you must have documentation of 2 doses or a titer result to show immunity.

Tetanus (Tdap): Those in an active clinical setting should show one dose within 2 years, those with no direct patient contact must have within the last 10 years.

Varicella (Chickenpox): You must have 2 immunizations, a report of positive titer, or report of illness date.

Tuberculosis (TB) skin Test (PPD): Proof of a negative reading within 12 months of the end date of clinical, or proof of a teter positive for antibodies. Chest Xray is required only if there is a history of positive PPD test. Xray must be after the date of positive PPD.

#### Additional Requirements:

A High School Diploma or GED, current physical and a criminal background check. All students must provide a satisfactory criminal history, which can be obtained through the Texas Dept. of Public Safety website. (www.txdps.state.tx.us). The following may disqualify a person from these programs: felony convictions; misdemeanor convictions involving crimes against persons; felony deferred adjudications for the sale, possession, distribution or transfer of narcotics or controlled substances; and registered sex offenders. All students must provide a current BLS CPR card, with the exception of Nurse Aide.



Students are trained by our American Heart Association (AHA) instructors to help infants as well as adults in an emergency situation. Classes run for 4.5 hours and a textbook is included. Students who successfully complete the training receive a CPR course completion card recognized by the American Heart Association.

#### Computer/Desktop Support Technician (OSA Certificate)

Technology jobs are in high demand! In as little as one semester you can prepare to work as a Desktop Support Technician and begin your pathway to a career in the tech field.

Student's Must Register for All Three Classes Listed Below.

#### IT Essential (70 Hours) | ITSC 1025.1901 | \$299

This course explores the PC system from software, hardware, and operating system points of view. CompTIA A+ topics are covered and include system boards, processors, memory, power supplies, input/output (I/O) ports, internal adapters, printers, and basic networking devices. Software topics include client/server operating systems and installation, as well as licensing software application. CompTIA A+ testing vouchers must be purchased separately. If you are interested in taking this course separately, please contact in the CE office.

#### Introduction to Networking (64 Hours) | ITNW 1025.1901 | \$299

Designed as a class for students looking to pass the Microsoft Technology Associate (MTA) Networking Fundamentals exam. Discussed are the fundamentals of computer networking including the Open Systems Interconnection (OSI) model, network architecture such as local area networks (LANs) and wide area networks (WANs) are addressed. Other topics of discussion include: Network topologies, Network protocols and services, Routers and switches, Wireless and access points, Virtual Private Networks (VPN), Security, &IP Addressing and Subnetting.

#### Help Desk Customer Service (15 Hours) | ITSC 1044.1901 | \$129

This course integrates the knowledge students attain from the A+ and Introduction to Networking courses with fundamental customer support concepts for the operation of a help desk or call center. Topics include: effective communication, customer service principles, troubleshooting, and problem resolution techniques.



# Pipefitting & Automotive Specialty





This intensive 16-week program is designed to familiarize students with the skills needed to go to work in the industry as a pipefitter and begin the NCCER certification process in pipefitting. This course presents material for the NCCER Core, level 1, level 2 and parts level 3, & 4. Topics include the use and care of pipefitting hand and power tools and various motorized equipment. Explore how to apply mathematical calculations, fabricate, socket and butt weld pipes, screw pipes, install pipe hangers and supports. Tuition does not include books, PPE, or personal tools. Students may choose to purchase those separately. A classroom set of books and tools will be available for use. You must enroll in all four courses concurrently. This program is eligible for a payment plan. Additional funds may be available from TWC.

#### NCCER Pipefitting Core and Level 1 \$299

This evening class concentrates on all modules of the NCCER Core and Level 1 curriculum. Topics include Safety, Pipefitting, Fabrications, Flanges and fasteners used in the trade. #### Diesel Engine Testing & Repair Certificate

This certificate program provides students seeking a career in diesel technology the skills necessary to successfully enter the workforce. Topics include the use of engine measuring tools and the principles of operations for major engine components. Students are briefed on the materials needed to take the ASE test of Diesel Engines. Textbooks are included in the tuition. Students must wear long sleeve shirts and pants in the shop. High School Diploma or GED is required. Classes are taught at the Ball High Automotive Center.

#### Diesel Level 1 (offered in Fall semester only)

#### **Diesel Level 2**

Troubleshooting with virtual equipment is explored in this course. Student's must take Diesel Level 1 or have prior experience working with diesel motors prior to enrollment. Skills from Level 1 are expanded to include diagnostics. 

#### Basic Water Works Operations (20 Hours) \$225

EPCT 1015.1917 | 1/22-1/26 | M-F | 6:00pm-10:00pm | R-252 | McLean

This 20-hour, one week, evening course includes instruction in the production, treatment or distribution of potable water. Discover the origin and characteristics of water, disinfection and storage, and distribution systems. Explore basic safety measures regarding your water system and how to handle the public relations issues that develop surrounding water resources. Upon successful completion of Basic Water Works Operations training, participants have exposure to techniques that will allow for the proper operation and maintenance of water and wastewater systems.

#### Basic Wastewater Operations (20 Hours) \$225

EPCT 1025.1913 | 2/12-2/16 | M-F | 6:00pm-10:00pm | R-252 | McLean

This introductory course in wastewater collection and treatment includes a brief overview of the water cycle. A general description of the responsibilities of wastewater system personnel is presented with an emphasis on the need for regulation of wastewater discharge to protect receiving streams and public health, safety, and welfare. Topics include: activated sludge process; alternative and advanced treatment; characteristics of wastewater; flow measurements; lift (pumping) stations; ponds, disinfection and safety procedures; preliminary treatment; records and reports; sedimentation and fixed-film processes collection systems; biological treatment of wastewater; goals of wastewater treatment; the law and sources of pretreatment of domestic wastes; water cycle and water reuse. Also included are Texas' rules and regulations for licensing of wastewater system operators.

#### Water Utility Collection (20 Hours) \$225

EPCT 2021.1909 | 3/5-3/9 | M-F | 6:00pm-10:00pm | R-252 | McLean

Explore the practical aspects of operating and maintaining wastewater collection systems, while understanding what is involved in the wastewater operator licensing program and the collection system design. Safety procedures for inspection and testing of collection system, inspection of manholes, and underground repair are presented. Classroom discussion includes lift stations, collection system maintenance and operations; industrial waste monitoring; collection system management.

#### Water Utility Calculations (20 Hours) \$225

This course introduces and provides information on the fundamentals of basic arithmetic, the use of formulas, and area and volume calculations in water and wastewater treatment plants. Topics: how to calculate and measure flow, keep records and report calculations.

Upon successful completion of this course, participants are eligible to sit for the Class C state certification exam.

#### Please register at least one (1) week prior to class start dates.

Please register at least one week prior to class start date. Tuition and fees must be paid upon registration. Students must complete registration five business days prior to a course starting. Students can register online at www.gc.edu/CEregister with a valid MasterCard, Visa, Discover Card or Amex.

You may register in person by coming to the Continuing Education Office located on the first floor of Moody Hall, at 4015 Avenue Q, Galveston, TX 77550 We are open Monday through Friday from 8am – 5pm.

You may register over the phone by calling the Continuing Education Office at 409-944-1344.

You may fax your completed registration form (this form is available on our website) to 409-944-1501, Attn: CE Dept. This is available 24 hrs a day.

You may mail your registration form and send payment for tuition and fees to Galveston College, Continuing Education Registration, 4015 Avenue Q, Galveston, Texas 77550. Please do not send cash.

Senior Discounts: Classes listed with a "\*" are eligible for a 50% senior discount for those over the age of 65 and who live in-district. This discount is applied upon registration.

Class Cancellations, Room Changes and Rescheduling: Courses with low enrollment prior to a start date are canceled prior to the start date. Students will be notified by phone or email when a class they are enrolled in has been canceled, however we are sometimes unable to reach everyone. A refund of 100% is automatically processed upon cancellation of classes. To help avoid cancellations please register at least a week prior to the start date, and encourage your friends to register with you. Occasionally, canceled courses are rescheduled for a later start date, and you will be notified by phone when the opportunity presents itself. In the event of a class room change notice of the room change will be posted on the continuing education doors and the classroom that was originally listed.

**Refunds:** Refunds prior to the start of class will be 100%. Refund requests should be made in person or by phone to 409-944-1344. Refund requests must be received during normal business hours and at least one business day prior to the start date of the class. FERPA: The Family Educational Rights and Privacy act (FERPA), was established to protect the privacy rights of all students. FERPA specifies the types of student information, which can be released to the public without a students expressed consent and specifies the persons and agencies that may receive other information, which according the FERPA, a college may release to the public without a student's permission and is referred to as "Directory Information". The information included in the FERPA definition includes: Name, address, telephone, date and place of birth, degrees earned, date, major, and field of study, academic classification, dates of attendance, number of semester hours in progress, and attained to date, previous high school and college attended and weight and height of member of athletic teams. Students may request that Galveston College withhold their directory information from the general public. To do so, students must fill out the appropriate form with the Admissions Office.

Record Of Completion And CEU's: Nationally recognized CEU's may be awarded on certain approved occupation-related courses. One CEU is awarded for every 10 contact hours. All courses will be given a certificate of completion. It is up to the individual student to see if these courses are eligible for CEU's.
