Galveston College supports the concept that learning can and does occur outside the traditional college classroom. In today's world, many students may acquire substantial education through intensive reading, travel, correspondence courses, continuing education, military experiences, and other non-traditional avenues of learning.

Students may earn credit by an evaluation of various credentials, including but not limited to the following:

- State or national board exams/certifications (LVN, RN, Law Enforcement, etc.)
- Non-traditional transcripts (hospital-based schools, cosmetology, etc.)
- Formal military training.

Credit by examination programs include, but are not limited to the following:

- Course Challenge by Examination
- CLEP - The College Entrance Examination Board, College Level Examination Program
- AP - The College Entrance Examination Board Advanced Placement Program Examination
- International Baccalaureate (IB)

ARTICULATED TECH
PREP COURSE
CREDIT

Students may earn credit by an evaluation of work completed in one or more years of a high school technical program or through a formal Tech Prep Articulation Agreement.

AWARDING CREDIT
FOR CONTINUING
EDUCATION
COURSES

Galveston College may award academic credit for continuing education courses only when there is documentation that the continuing education coursework is equivalent to a designated credit course.

The College President or designee in consultation with the faculty shall develop additional guidelines and procedures, as appropriate, to support the awarding of credit by examination or by experience and previous training.
